#### Committee Activities

• 7 meetings held since the last AGM

(December, February, May, June (on site), August, September and October)

- Some issues discussed :

- Participation in local fetes

#### National Grid Landscape Enhancement Project

- Grant worth £ 127k to Leckhampton Hill over three years
- Cash administered through CKPC and spent on projects outlined in the original bid
- Matched funding required of £35k (largely as volunteer labour)
- Projects commenced:
  - Cotswold Way resurfacing
  - Tree felling on the Incline
  - Enhanced grazing (GPS collars)
  - Fencing refurbishment
  - Gorse clearance
  - Walling

#### National Grid Landscape Enhancement Project

- Project at half way stage, £46k funds remain to be spent
- Matched funding £27k out of target £35k already achieved
- Future Projects:
  - Veteran Tree maintenance
  - Selective Larch felling
  - Lime Kilns maintenance
  - Gorse clearance
  - Walling
  - Commissioning of a new Management Plan

- Offer of free membership continued
- Followers on Facebook now over 1,600
- Number of members

## Major Works Carried Out

- Cotswold Wall rebuild beside Cotswold Way continues (Cotswold Wardens) together with erection of the new Memorial Wall
- Refurbishment of fencing to facilitate grazing
- Help with resurfacing the Cotswold Way and improving disabled access
- Gorse clearance an ongoing task
- Assistance with Standard Gauge Incline resurfacing

## Work Party Statistics 2021/22

- No Work Parties cancelled due to Covid-19 although 3 succumbed to wet or hot weather
- Approximately 55 different volunteers
- 1,441 volunteer Work Party hours logged
- Number at Work Parties ranged from 9 to 26

## Work Parties Report 2021/22

- Tasks completed over last year include
  - removing gorse, hawthorn and bramble
  - annual mowing and clearance in various areas
  - removing Ragwort
  - removing growth to re-expose Cotswold stone walls and fence lines
  - demolition of old walls to prepare for rebuild and moving stone
  - clearing debris after contractor's felling
- Additional support provided by Atkins, Kohler Mira, Capita and Gloucester Vale
  Conservation Volunteers
- Provided opportunities for local school's participating in the DoE Awards Scheme

### Cotswold Voluntary Wardens

- The volunteer arm of the Cotswold National Landscape
- Spent approximately 1,400 man hours on Leckhampton Hill in 2021/22
- Building the 'Hartley Lane' Wall
- Building the Memorial Wall
- Assistance with refurbishing of fencing, saving CBC large sums of money

#### Council for the Preservation of Rural England

The efforts of both FOLK and the Cotswold Voluntary Wardens enabled a successful application to be made to the CPRE for an award.

The citation from CPRE said the following:

The Awards judges were unanimous in their view that the great improvements that have been achieved on Leckhampton Hill and Charlton Kings Common should be recognised through a CPRE Gloucestershire Award.

# Cycling on the Hill

- Walkers, Cheltenham & County Cycling Club, FOLK and Cheltenham Borough Council are working so that all users can use the hill safely
- Most established mountain bike tracks will remain with minor modifications to improve safety for walkers
- Some minor tracks have been blocked off where risks for walkers cannot be mitigated
- Others have been facilitated
- Signage will be installed to warn walkers and cyclists of each other's presence

## Financial Report

- Income £870
  - (includes £395 from Cheltenham Lottery, £300 from L&WHPC , £50 from Shurdington PC and £100 from CKPC)
- Expenditure £1,453
  - (major items include noticeboard repairs, insurance and work party materials & tools)
- Deficit for the year £583
- £1,500 received in prior year from the Sir Charles Irving Trust now earmarked as contribution to the Management Plan
- £675 reserved for purchase of a defibrillator for work parties
- Total available funds at year end £2,363

## The coming year

- Gorse clearance by contractors and volunteers to enhance grassland and reduce fire risk
- Making diseased and end of life trees safe for visitors
- Rebuilding a dry stone wall to mount memorial plaques and continue with other walls
- Continued removal of invasive plant species
